More Information on the Share-a-thon

The Share-a-thon is a practice session for project presentations. Your team will have a 7-1/2 minute slot to present your project (including setup) and take questions from the audience.

1. Sharing: Sharing your results is one of the requirements for completing the FLL project. To help you prepare for such presentations, we hold the Share-a-Thon as an opportunity to practice your presentation amongst the FLL community in a friendly and encouraging environment.

2. Feedback: This is an opportunity for the kids to get constructive feedback. Please provide constructive comments like: "That's a clever way of doing X" or "I got lost when you said Y. Could you explain that differently?"

3. Discussion: The Share-a-thon will be an opportunity for the kids to share ideas on doing the project. Please come prepared to discuss questions such as:

- How did you choose a topic?
- Where did you find experts? What was your experience in contacting them?
- Did you run an experiment or build a prototype?
- How did you choose your style of presentation (e.g. formal or entertaining)
- What went well? What was hard?

Teams who don't have a project this year or who are not ready to present are encouraged to attend to participate in the discussion and get tips on doing the project.

If you feel reluctant to share your team's 'trade secrets', please remember two FLL Core Values:

- What we discover is more important than what we win.
- We share our experiences with others.

If every team gives a little, we can all go home with a lot.

The Share-a-thon is open to all FLL teams, regardless of whether they are attending the Los Altos tournament. There is \$5 charge per team to present which helps cover the cost of room rental. (Spectators are free.)

Aside from helping teams prepare for their sharing requirement, your team's participation at the Share-a-thon has no effect on your results at tournament. Feel free to invite friends who might have relevant expertise to share with the kids or who might become interested in FLL.
